The light blue text is representative of St Mary (the patron saint of the church) (St Andrew, Meonstoke has dark blue and St Peter and St Paul, Exton have red text for martyrs). All the Benefice's churches have distinct



arches, so the three arches, suggesting a bridge for the Meon Bridge Benefice, represent the three parishes. The four 'feet' symbolise the four historic buildings on which the benefice is built. The border surrounding the whole shows we are separate parishes joined into a single Benefice within the Diocese of Portsmouth.

There is a Canterbury Cross on each foot representing the fact that we are rooted in the Anglican tradition (Church of England, Province of Canterbury.
